Port de Gustavia serves as the St Barths flagship harbour for Leeward luxury weeks. Located in the Caribbean region, this destination marina accommodates charter yachts with an indicative maximum LOA of 80 metres and a maximum draft of 5 metres.

PILOTAGE NOTES

Approach

Approach Port de Gustavia with local pilotage notes from the captain; high season berths book weeks ahead. Fuel, water and shore power are available - confirm waste and amp rating before arrival.

HOLDS & LEAD TIMES

Berthing

Peak berths typically need 4-12 weeks for peak season slips. We hold anchorage fallbacks before you fly.

TRANSFERS

Door to deck

Typical SBH quay timing: 10-20 min from SBH. Timed to embarkation, not a taxi scramble.

AIRPORT SBH

TYPICAL TRANSFER 10-20 min from SBH

EMBARK UTILITY

Embark at Port de Gustavia

Door-to-deck for Caribbean: fly into the gateway, transfer timed to the gangway, luggage aboard before guests. We choreograph the buffer - not a taxi scramble.

MEETING POINT	Meeting point: Port de Gustavia - confirm quay / pontoon with the captain the morning of embarkation.
ARRIVAL BUFFER	Plan 60-90 minutes from wheels-down to passerelle for chauffeur corridors; helicopter windows are tighter when helipad access is confirmed.
PEAK LEAD TIME	Peak berths typically need 4-12 weeks for peak season slips. We hold anchorage fallbacks before you fly.

Captain notes

Approach Port de Gustavia with local pilotage notes from the captain; high season berths book weeks ahead. Fuel, water and shore power are available - confirm waste and amp rating before arrival.

Tender fallback

When berths are scarce we hold a sheltered anchorage + tender (or captain-only standby) plan before you fly - never a last-minute scramble at the mole.

Luggage / hotel

Night-before hotel near the gateway (or marina) when late arrivals risk missing the embarkation slot - we hold rooms against the transfer plan.

SBH

Typical SBH quay: 10-20 min from SBH. Typical transfer: 10-20 min from SBH

TIMING

Seasonal note

Peak density tracks Caribbean high season and local events - 4-12 weeks for peak season slips lead time is typical for larger LOA.

INDICATIVE DRAFT

Berth fees

Indicative seasonal berth ranges are shared on request - confirm with the marina agent before contract. We never publish unverified nightly rates as fact.

BEFORE YOU FLY

Berthing FAQ

How do I embark at Port de Gustavia?

Confirm quay / pontoon with the captain the morning of embarkation after your SBH arrival. We brief the chauffeur on the correct marina gate - not a generic harbour drop.

Can I berth a yacht at Port de Gustavia?

Yes when LOA, draft and event weeks allow. 4-12 weeks for peak season slips Blue Ocean Club opens the berth conversation with the yacht shortlist for Caribbean.

What does berthing cost at Port de Gustavia?

Berthing at Port de Gustavia is quoted by LOA, season and events - we share indicative ranges labelled as draft, then confirm in writing before deposit. Never treat a published nightly figure as a hard fact.

Is yacht charter available from Port de Gustavia?

Yes - Port de Gustavia is a practical embarkation for crewed yacht charter in Caribbean. We sequence the berth, transfers and first-night plan before you fly.

How far ahead should we book a berth at Port de Gustavia?

4-12 weeks for peak season slips

What is the practical embarkation airport for Port de Gustavia?

Typical SBH quay timing: 10-20 min from SBH. Timed to embarkation, not a taxi scramble.

Can we overnight at anchor instead of taking a quay night?

Colombier, St Barths is a common alternative when the quay is full - captains confirm holding and shelter before committing.

What services should we expect at Port de Gustavia?

Port de Gustavia typically offers fuel, shore power, water, waste/pump-out, harbour Wi-Fi. Confirm amp rating and pump-out against your LOA before arrival.

Indicative guidance - some berth fee notes are labelled draft. Live rates move with LOA, season and events. Blue Ocean Club confirms in writing before deposit. No invented phone numbers or reviews. Not a substitute for captain pilotage or marina contracts.
